Unit Clarification

Since “Unit Clarification” presented itself as an issue in July, ASPRO has reported on its success in convincing the Governor to veto the biennial budget language directing the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission (WERC) to assign academic staff positions to existing classified staff unions. And ASPRO leadership met with UW President Kevin Reilly, Regent John Drew, and WERC’s Peter Davis to express ASPRO’s opposition to unit clarification.

We have heard from members who have followed up on ASPRO’s suggestion to communicate with legislators about unit clarification; and we thank you for those efforts.

ASPRO regularly checks with the WERC and, to date, no union has submitted a petition to the WERC claiming that certain academic staff positions should be folded into their existing union ranks.
